

Point-in-Time (PIT) homeless counts provide a snapshot of people who are experiencing homelessness in a 24-hour period, their demographic characteristics, service use and other information.


For the purpose of this count, an individual was defined as experiencing homelessness if they did not have a place of their own where they paid rent and could expect to stay for at least 30 days.

PIT counts are an undercount and represent only those individuals identified during a 24-hour period.





Experienced homelessness over the past year



• 27% always lived in the community (compared to 16% in 2023)

• 75% were unsheltered (compared to 65% unsheltered in 2020)





- 38% of respondents identified as indigenous (compared to 28% in 2023)
- 64% of respondents identified male (compared to 59% in 2023)
- 6% of respondents identified as 2SLGBTQIA+ (compared to 12% in 2023)
- More seniors in the count. In the 2023 PiT count, 27% of respondents were seniors 55+, compared to 40% in 2024.


